Bilingualism: an opportunity to be seized

Fribourg is home to Switzerland's only bilingual university. Nearly all subjects offer students the opportunity to pursue their studies in French, German or both languages. Those who complete their studies by attending at least 40% of the courses in a second language will receive a degree with the mention “Bilingual Studies”. Furthermore, international study programs are offered in English.

At the University of Fribourg, no-one is lost in the crowd. The ideal size of the institution and the commitment of our teaching staff enable students to benefit from a personalised support.

An international atmosphere

Since its establishment in 1889, the University of Fribourg has enjoyed an international reputation. Today, there are students from 110 nationalities who study here.

Compared to other Swiss cities, the cost of living in Fribourg is relatively low. In and around the city, it is quite easy for students to find a room in a hostel or in a shared flat at an affordable price.

The city of Fribourg is a medieval jewel. The historic centre with its Gothic cathedral, narrow alleys, old bridges, taverns and picturesque squares make it a particularly pleasant place to live in. Its location at the foothills of the Alps and less than 20 kilometres from the Murten Lake offers a wide range of recreational and sporting activities.
